

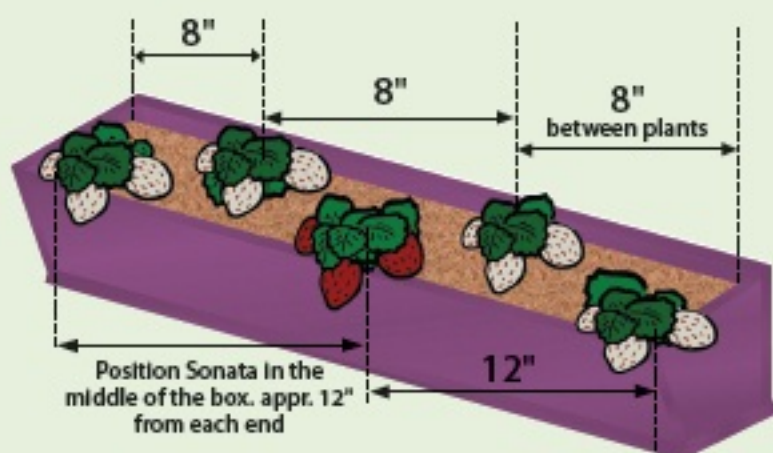
THE PINEBERRY THRIVES IN MANY GROWING SITUATIONS

Whether you plant the Natural Albino® Pineberry in window boxes or your garden, you will enjoy its delicate white flowers three to four weeks after planting and depending on weather conditions, you will see fruit developing approximately four weeks after pollination. Soon you will be able to taste the exceptional fruit! The plant is vigorous and winter hardy to zone 3 in your garden as long as they are mulched well with straw for winter protection.

Window box Container

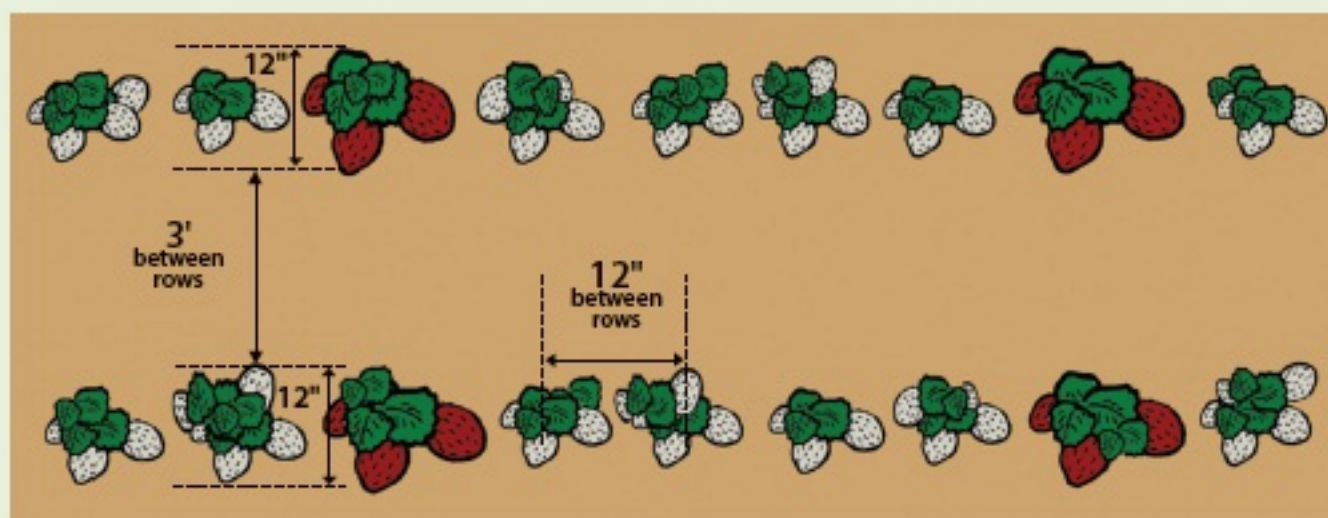
(Recommended minimum size box: 10" width × 9" depth × 24" length)



Instructions for planting a window box: Fill the window box with a soilless potting mix. Arrange the plug plants according to the diagram above. One Sonata strawberry should be centered between every four (4) Natural Albino® Pineberry plants. Water thoroughly and keep the soil moist (but not wet) throughout the growing season. (Recommended strawberry bed layout: 10 plants will require a row length of 10'-11')



Instructions for planting in a garden bed: Prepare the soil as for any strawberry planting. (Refer to our planting guide for more details.) Strawberries prefer a well-drained soil and a soil pH between 6 and 7. Allow 12" between plants in the row and arrange the plants so that there is a Sonata strawberry in between every four (4) Natural Albino® Pineberry plants. See the diagram above.

PROPER CARE AND MAINTENANCE [GARDEN/WINDOW BOX]

- Prepare soil as for any strawberry planting. A well-draining soil with a pH between 6 and 7 is best. Please refer to our planting guide for more details.
- In order for pollination to occur, one Sonata strawberry plant must be planted with every four Natural Albino® Pineberry plants. Plants are therefore being sold only as bundles of five (5) plants including four (4) Natural Albino® Pineberry and one (1) Sonata strawberry.
- Plant the plugs so there is a ½ inch of soil over the top. Water thoroughly after planting to assure soil-to-plug contact. Plugs can be dipped (not soaked) in an Agri-gel® solution. Continue providing water to your plants through the harvest season.
- Fertilize after planting with a solution of water-soluble fertilizer. Mix one (1) tablespoon of a 20-20-20 soluble fertilizer/plant food per gallon of water. Use one (1) gallon of fertilizer solution per ten (10) feet of row. Use the fertilizer solution weekly until you see the berries beginning to form. If the soil starts to become dry, you will need to water the plants additionally with plain water during the week.
- Plants will begin to flower in 3-4 weeks. **Do not remove blossoms/flowers!** (This is contrary to the instructions regarding any other strawberries mentioned in the planting guide.) Flowers will develop into fruit over the next three to four weeks.
- Cut and remove all runners (daughters) to allow the Natural Albino® plant to perform at its peak.
- **Garden:** Maintain your planting for next year's crop by protecting the plants with a layer of straw mulch in the late fall through early spring.
- **Window box:** Before winter, take the window box inside (garage or cellar) to protect from cold weather.
